

## Place Value - HTU

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Digits have different values for different positions in a number.

Whole numbers can be hundreds (H), tens (T) or units (U)

In this number, there are 3 hundreds, 2 tens and 4 units:

$$300 + 20 + 4 = 324$$






An abacus is made up of rows of beads to show the hundreds, tens and units. This is what they used a long time ago before calculators!




